Entry requirements

Teaching English Language to Adults (CELTA)

- 2 A Levels and 5 GCSEs or equivalent. You also need to have a very good command of written and spoken English. No previous teaching experience is necessary.
- You do not need a degree to enrol on the CELTA course. However, applicants should be aware that when seeking teaching employment after the course, some employers in some countries may require a degree.

Diploma in Education and Training (DET) / Professional Graduate Certificate of Education (ProfGCE)

You'll need to be teaching or training, either paid or voluntary, while the course is running. All teaching must be in an appropriate FE and Skills provider, Sixth Form College, School/Academy, Public or private training organisation. You must have responsibility for the group that you are teaching (planning and assessing the learning). You'll need to complete a minimum of 100 hours of teaching over the two years with at least 40 hours in the first year. Please note that you are responsible for securing your teaching practice; the college does not provide teaching placements.

- You will need to have a work-based mentor to provide subject knowledge guidance and assess your teaching.
 - Successful completion of a pre-course test and an interview.
- Applicants for the Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (ProfGCE) are required to have a degree.
- You should possess at least a Level 3 qualification in the subject area you want to teach or considerable professional experience as well as a good level of literacy and numeracy skills.
- IT skills to word process assignments and prepare teaching materials.

 A successful Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check.
