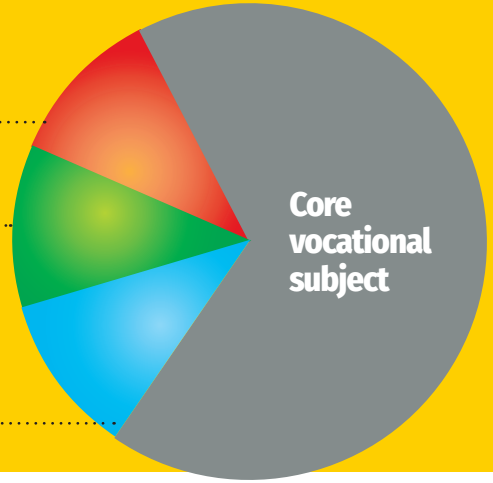

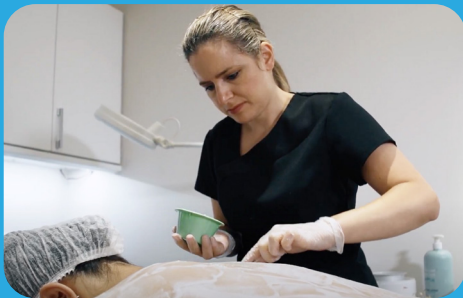
Nadeem Chattha

Employment

Employers value BTEC qualifications as courses are industry-focused, giving students industry-specific knowledge and skills, making them readily employable.

The experience of real-life practical tasks and work placements really do prepare students for the real world of employment, unlike A Levels.

Practical Assessments vs Exams

BTECs are mostly assessed on coursework and work experience, which makes them a better option for those who find the pressure of exams difficult.



Careers Service

Our team of independent careers advisers helps students make the right decision for their future and identify the skills they need to succeed.

We will always try to make sure that students enrol on a suitable course. However, if during the first few weeks your son or daughter feels that they are on the wrong course, they should come and see us to discuss alternative options.



Work Experience

We help all our students to complete work experience placements. Work experience helps them practice the skills they learn in the classroom and gives them an advantage when applying for university or a job.

We bring employers to the college for talks, workshops and our Aspire Careers Events so that students can learn first-hand about working life and career opportunities.

Applying to University

We guide and support students who want to go to university. Once they have an offer, we help prepare them for the selection test and interview.

We hold an annual Higher Education Fair and information events for students, parents and guardians about going to university.

Applying for a Job or apprenticeship

If your son or daughter is looking for a job or apprenticeship after their course, or a part-time job whilst they are studying, we can help them develop their CV and prepare for interviews.

Student facilities

The College is not just a place to study.

Activities and events

Activities take place throughout the year in the Atrium, Theatre and Student Common Room at both centres, from Freshers' Fair during Induction Week to our Creative Arts Season during the summer term. Events include talent shows, charity fundraising activities, guest speakers and awareness raising events around issues that affect young people. We encourage all our students to get involved! It's fun, educational and a great way to meet new friends.

Sport and fitness

Whether your son/daughter wants to represent the college playing in competitive leagues, or just keep fit for fun, we've got sports and fitness activities to suit everyone – badminton, table tennis, basketball, football, netball, dodgeball, futsal, boxing, swimming, yoga, zumba – you name it! We've got a fantastic sports hall and outdoor grass and astroturf sports pitches. Students can join our gym for just £15 a year.

Maths and English Hub

Students who are looking to improve their English and Maths skills, completing homework, get support with writing assignments or revising before exams can get dedicated support at our Maths and English Hub. A timetable of activities is displayed on plasma screens outside the ME Zone or simply drop in during the sessions.

Learning Resources Centre

The LRC at Isleworth has everything students need to help with their studies: books, DVDs, journals, e-resources, quiet study areas, drop-in IT facilities (Macs and PCs) and dedicated, helpful staff.

Access to computers

Students will be given an induction on how to use Moodle, the college's student learning portal, at the start of their course. They can access a computer in any area of the college with their student ID and password. Offsite access is available via the college website, west-thames.ac.uk

Life at College

Success of students is important to us. We encourage students to take responsibility for their learning and work hard to achieve their goals.





Standards for Success

We have high expectations for our students. Our standards for success state what we expect and what we don't expect, along with the support we give to help our students achieve. Your son or daughter will sign a Student Learning Contract to help them reach their full potential.

Homework

All full time students at West Thames College are expected to study outside of lessons. This additional study is essential for them to achieve or exceed their target grade.

Failure to work outside of lessons will disadvantage students in terms of their final grade. Homework is set in order to:

- Reinforce and consolidate work covered in lessons
- Encourage independent and reflective learning
- Develop a deeper knowledge and understanding
- Prepare students for future lessons or assessments
- Promote an interest in learning
- Enable teachers to make a judgment about a student's progress and level of attainment.

Homework should be varied in terms of tasks and relevant and rewarding for students and it may constitute ongoing work on an assignment. Please encourage your son or daughter to complete their homework on the day it is set, when the topic and tasks should still be fresh in their minds. The full homework policy is available to students on Moodle.

Reporting absence

If a student is unable to attend class e.g. due to sickness, they must contact the Curriculum Administrator (see Key Contacts) before the class is due to start and must contact their Student Learning Adviser (SLA) as soon as they return to college. Students should make arrangements to catch up on any work missed during absence.

Holidays are not to be booked during term time and non-urgent appointments should be scheduled outside of college hours.

Contact with parents

We will contact parents/carers about attendance and progress of students aged under 19 years. You will also be invited to parents' evenings and other events throughout the year.

24-hour exclusion

If a student persistently disrupts a lesson or behaves badly, they will be excluded for 24 hours. The student will be interviewed by a senior manager before they are allowed back to class.

Smoking, drugs and alcohol

Smoking is not permitted in any college building or near any entrances. It is only allowed in designated outdoor smoking areas which are clearly signposted. Disciplinary action will be taken against anyone in possession of, or under the influence of, illegal drugs or alcohol on college premises.

Religion and faith

We are a secular college where all faiths are respected, but we do not permit the promotion of any faith. We do not have an allocated prayer room, but rooms that are free may be designated as quiet areas, which can be used for individual reflection, meditation and contemplation by students and staff. To find out more, students should speak to a member of the Student Experience team in the Common Room.

Equality

The college is committed to providing equal opportunities for all students through a supportive and challenging environment. We celebrate diversity and seek to raise the aspirations of all our students. We promote good relations between people of different religions, nationalities and racial groups and will challenge inequalities arising from race, sex, class, disability, sexuality or age.

Changing course

If during their first few weeks at college your son or daughter does not feel they are on the right course, please contact us. It is important that the student does not simply do nothing or drop out! Please ask for an appointment with the SLA for you and/or your son or daughter to explore the options. The SLA can also arrange a guidance interview with one of our careers advisers to help find a suitable alternative.

Making a complaint

If your son/daughter has a complaint, they should speak to their SLA in the first instance. If the matter is not resolved, they can make a formal complaint. Leaflets are available at the Information Centre or see our website for details.

Support advice & guidance

West Thames College is renowned for its friendly, welcoming atmosphere. You can rest assured that your son/daughter will be in a safe learning environment with all the support they need to enjoy their time at college and succeed with their studies.



Tutorial support

A Tutor/Student Learning Adviser (SLA) will monitor academic progress, attendance and punctuality to make sure students stay on track. Students meet regularly with the SLA, who is the first point of contact if there are any problems with the course or the student's progress.

Disability support

We welcome and support students with disabilities and learning difficulties. We will aim to meet any additional needs students have so they can participate in learning and succeed with their studies. For more information on support available, including equipment and adjustments, and support with English and maths, see the Head of Inclusion who is based on the second floor of the Learning Resources Centre, or call 020 8326 2103.

Careers, advice and guidance

Our advisers help our students work toward their next step – employment, an apprenticeship, another course or higher education. They can help with CV and interview techniques and applying to university via UCAS, and they have a list of job, apprenticeship and volunteer vacancies.

Financial and welfare support

If there are financial problems, questions about benefits, accommodation or immigration issues, contact the SLA or phone 020 8326 2412 to speak to our financial support and welfare adviser.

Counselling

If students are experiencing any personal problems, emotional issues or difficulties, they can talk in confidence to one of our qualified counsellors.

Sexual health and relationships

Sexual health and relationships advice and free condoms are available from the Student Common Room at Isleworth or Feltham or from the SLA.

Keeping safe

Students are issued with an ID card which they should wear at all times when in college. Students are not allowed into college without an ID card and must show it when asked by a member of staff.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding is the process of creating a safe environment for all students and staff that actively prevents harm, harassment, bullying, abuse and neglect.

The college Safeguarding Team work internally and externally with others to offer support, advice and information to students who may have had or are having difficulties in their life or who are feeling unsafe for any reason.

Students experiencing such difficulties can speak to their SLA, trusted member of staff or a member of the Student Experience team based in the Student Common Room at Isleworth or Feltham.

At West Thames College we believe that students should be able to use the internet for education and personal development, but safeguards need to be put in place to ensure that they are kept safe at all times. The online world provides everyone with many opportunities; however it can also present risks and challenges. The college and our Partners have a duty to ensure that all young people and adults involved in our organisation are protected from potential harm online when using our network and devices.

We recognise the importance of working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare and in helping young people to be responsible in their approach to online safety.
